A new opportunity for graduates and researchers, the one-year MSc in Evidence-Based Social Work, and associated doctoral program, has been announced by Oxford University. This course teaches students about methodology and findings in the fields of empirically-based interventions in areas such as child and family problems, HIV / AIDS, adult and child mental health, antisocial behavior, community-based intervention, refugees and asylum seekers.
