## 1. NIDA INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH TRAINING AND EXCHANGE OPPORTUNITIES

The National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) supports international scientific collaboration through research training and scientific exchanges. Scientists may participate in one of two NIDA International Program (<http://www.international.drugabuse.gov/>) research training programs, the INVEST Research Fellowships (competitive, 12-month postdoctoral appointments to U.S. institutions for scientists from other countries) or the NIDA Humphrey Drug Abuse Research Fellowships (competitive, 10-month fellowships for mid-career drug abuse professionals from developing and transitional countries). NIDA research exchange programs—the Distinguished International Scientist Collaboration Award for U.S. Citizens and Permanent Residents (USDISCA) or the Distinguished International Scientist Collaboration Award (DISCA)—allow senior scientists from other countries and NIDA grantees to work together for 1 to 3 months in the most suitable locale for their joint research.
