#### 1. 2005 SUMMER INSTITUTE ON LONGITUDINAL METHODS

The Methodology Center at Penn State is pleased to announce the 2005 Summer Institute on Longitudinal Methods. This year, Paul Allison will present a workshop on survival analysis. Note that a limited number of scholarships will be available for minority or under funded post-docs or junior faculty.

#### 2. GRADUATE AND UNDERGRADUATE SUMMER RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM IN PSYCHOLOGY (SROP)

Program objectives are to provide students with the preparation to become research scholars, stimulate serious consideration of Ph.D. study, prepare students for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), and pursue careers in university teaching and research. This year's SROP will commence on June 5 and continue until August 5, 2005. The program is accepting 8 undergraduate and 4 pre-masters level graduate students into SROP. Travel, stipend (approximately \$2,500 for undergraduates & \$3,000 for graduate students), room & board, tuition (4 credit hours from the University of Utah) and GRE preparation expenses are paid for all students selected into the program. SROP is funded by the University of Utah and the National Institute of Mental Health.
