The latest issue of the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) NewsScan, #32, includes: NIDA Director, Dr. Nora Volkow's study on the mechanism behind stimulant medication for ADHD; a PET study revealing how bupropion works to reduce cigarette cravings; research exploring topiramate's usefulness as a potential treatment for cocaine addiction; neuroimaging data that shows cocaine craving activates different brain regions in women; and a study showing that adult and adolescent rats respond differently to nicotine.
