The University of Texas School of Public Health (UTSPH) seeks a senior biostatistician to take a leadership role in the Coordinating Center for Clinical Trials. This is a tenure-track faculty position at the Associate or Full Professor level in the Division of Biostatistics at The University of Texas School of Public Health, Houston campus in the Texas Medical Center.

The Coordinating Center for Clinical Trials (CCCT) was established in 1971 and has been a leader in cardiovascular, neurologic, and vision research. The CCCT has received almost \$200 million dollars in funding and has served as a coordinating center for several landmark clinical trials. This position offers extensive opportunities for research and collaboration. UTSPH is an integral part of The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, located in the world-renowned Texas Medical Center, which comprises the largest concentration of healthcare institutions in the world. Responsibilities will include teaching graduate-level courses, conducting funded research, and public health service.
