After our recent conference, SPR was contacted by CDC's Division of Violence Prevention. Several of their scientific staff attended the conference, and they have indicated that they would like to forge a stronger relationship with SPR. Many of you may be aware of CDC's work and may have received funds from them but some may not. I suggested sending an email via our listserv to inform members of CDC's work. Below is a description of the Division of Violence Prevention, and links to various aspects of their work, including a link to register for email notifications about new funding announcements.

The Division of Violence Prevention (DVP) is part of CDC's National Center for Injury Prevention and Control (NCIPC). DVP works to prevention several major areas of violence: child maltreatment, youth violence, intimate partner violence, sexual violence, and suicide. DVP conducts surveillance and etiologic research, prevention development and evaluation research, and dissemination research. DVP offers funding via a variety of mechanisms, including grants, cooperative agreements, and contracts.
