

### **Tenure-Track Position in Clinical Psychology, Clark University, Massachusetts**

Clark University invites applications for a tenure-track position in Clinical psychology at the Assistant Professor rank to begin in fall 2010. Noted for its rich history in Psychology, Clark University offers the advantages of both a distinguished research university and a small liberal arts college (see <http://www.clarku.edu/~psydept>). We seek candidates whose research has the potential for synergy across our three doctoral programs (clinical, developmental, and social), and with other scholarship in the university. Candidates are expected to have a clear program of research, as well as a strong commitment to securing external funding. Area of research may include one or more of the following: children, health psychology (broadly conceived), and underserved and diverse populations. Preference will be given to candidates whose research links with the community, and who are licensed or license-eligible in Massachusetts.

Candidates should also be committed to effective undergraduate and graduate teaching, advising, and research mentoring. The candidate will be expected to teach courses in his/her areas of interest as well as courses in our introductory and mid-level undergraduate sequence (e.g., statistics, research methods, introductory psychology).

Applicants should send a statement of research and teaching interests, CV, and representative publications, and should arrange to have three letters of recommendation sent directly to Chair of the Clinical Search Committee at: The Frances L.
