

Clinical-community faculty position at DePaul University

A full-time, Assistant Professor tenure-track faculty position in the Community track of the Clinical Psychology program beginning in September, 2010. Excellent teaching skills and a commitment to undergraduate and graduate instruction are prerequisites. A strong background in research and a high quality research agenda are also essential. In addition, the following qualities are preferred: research interest in community psychology with multicultural, low-income urban populations; quantitative, qualitative, and/or methodological strengths; and experience with external research funding. The successful candidate will be expected: (1) to teach courses in the Psychology Department's undergraduate core curriculum and to contribute to the university's Liberal Studies curriculum; (2) to contribute to graduate teaching and thesis and dissertation supervision in Clinical Community Psychology; and (3) to make distinctive contributions to the scientific literature in Clinical Community Psychology. DePaul University has a diverse student body and faculty. Our program is a recognized national model for diversity training in Clinical Psychology with tracks in Child and Community areas. Members of under-represented groups, including ethnic minorities, LGBT individuals, and people with disabilities, are especially encouraged to apply.
