

POSTDOCTORAL POSITION IN NEUROSCIENCE OF PREVENTION

The Prevention Research Center for Human Development at Penn State University is offering a postdoctoral position in that combines prevention research with neuroscience in the area of violence prevention. The position is available for two years with the possibility of renewal. The successful candidate will be involved in a project Directed by Drs. Mark Greenberg and Karen Bierman designed to assess the effectiveness of an early intervention program aimed at reducing aggression in high risk children.

Psychophysiological assessments including autonomic (cardiac and electrodermal) and EEG/ERP measures will be conducted longitudinally over the course of the three year study. Applicants should hold a Ph.D. in a relevant field or anticipate completing their degree in 2008. Experience with EEG is highly desirable.
