### 2. NIH LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAMS

NIH has extended its Loan Repayment Program eligibility to health professionals funded by nonprofit sources and non-NIH grants who are pursuing careers in the field of clinical, pediatric or health disparities research. The current application cycle opens September 1 and closes December 31, 2003. The NIH Loan Repayment Programs can offer repayment of up to \$35,000 per year of qualified educational loan and cover the tax liability of the loan payments.
