The Department of Behavioral Sciences and Health Education, Rollins School of Public Health seeks a scholar for a tenure track or tenured faculty appointment at the academic rank of assistant or early associate professor. Assistant professor candidates for tenure-track position must demonstrate the potential to become an independent investigator and graduate-level teacher. Associate professor candidates should have a strong record of scholarship with experience as a principal investigator for funded research studies (e.g., NIH, CDC) and interest and skills in teaching. Priority areas of study for these positions are Mental Health/Substance Use, especially alcohol use and/or depression, though other areas in health, clinical, and developmental psychology are of interest.
