

## **ASU Post-Doctoral Research Fellow in Family-centered Pediatric Health Psychology**

The Department of Psychology and Prevention Research Center at Arizona State University invite applications for a full time 12-month research fellowship starting August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013, with promise of extension for additional years contingent on funding. For this position, successful candidates must have clinical training and a Ph.D. in clinical, counseling, or school psychology, and training in empirically supported family interventions. Training and familiarity with the Family Check-up intervention model is preferred but not required. In addition, experience in research on family-centered interventions, health psychology, prevention science and pediatric psychology are desirable. Responsibilities include coordinating the direct implementation, and conducting translational research in pediatric health care settings (e.g., Phoenix Children's Hospital). In addition, this position affords the opportunity for supervision of doctoral students in research on pediatric settings, taking the lead on grant applications, and licensing as a psychologist. Responsibilities include designing assessment protocols, coordinating the development of web-based assessments, training and supervision of service providers, providing services to children and families, and collaborating to prepare grant applications, scientific and professional journal articles.

Application deadline is **February 22, 2013** or every week thereafter until filled.
