The Department of Psychiatry at the University of Illinois at Chicago seeks an outstanding researcher and leader to fill the position of Director for the Institute for Juvenile Research (IJR) and to continue its history of excellence in research, clinical work, and community linkages. Established in 1909, IJR was the first child mental health clinic in the nation and remains one of the country's premier research institutes integrating medicine, psychiatry, psychology, and social work under the umbrella of child mental health, IJR is housed with one of the largest Psychiatry departments in the Midwest, with 125 faculty, an excellent General Psychiatry Residency Training Program and several fellowships, including a nationally known Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Residency and Addictions and Women's Mental Health fellowships. We have a strong commitment to providing health care to the underserved populations in Chicago and are well positioned to participate in many new and exciting developments in the area of mental health and behavior. IJR is home to diverse, multidisciplinary faculty who lead research programs spanning genetics/genomics, to brain imaging, to clinical trials, to psychosocial services, school interventions and public health.

The Director of the Institute for Juvenile Research directs and provides leadership and oversight of all research and education within the institute. The successful candidate will have an MD or Ph.D. The successful candidate must be a respected researcher with credentials meriting full professorship, and a skilled administrator with significant expertise in program building, as well as the ability to develop relationships with the community.
