### Assistant Professor of Quantitative Psychology

The Department of Psychology at Arizona State University invites applications for a tenure-track position in **Quantitative Psychology** beginning August 2013. The successful candidate will be expected to make scholarly contributions in quantitative psychology; mentor graduate students; contribute to the applied statistical consultation of the quantitative group with substantive researchers across areas of psychology; and to teach advanced quantitative graduate courses *beyond* the ANOVA, Regression, Multivariate Analysis, and Introduction to Structural Equation Modeling sequence. The nationally-prominent Quantitative Psychology Program at ASU currently has five faculty and 13 active doctoral students. Ongoing collaborations exist with substantive researchers within the Department of Psychology and with quantitative faculty across campus. Arizona State University is located in the Phoenix/Scottsdale metropolitan area and offers all of the amenities of a large urban/winter resort area.

The requirements for this position include: (1) a Ph.D. in Quantitative Psychology or a closely related discipline; (2) evidence of scholarly contributions in quantitative psychology; and (3) a commitment to quality teaching at the graduate and undergraduate levels. Applicants with a focus in any area of measurement, research methods, or statistical modeling of psychological data are encouraged to apply.

Applicants must submit a curriculum vitae; reprints and/or preprints of publications; a letter describing research and teaching experience and interests; and a minimum of three letters of reference. Lists of relevant coursework and evidence of quality teaching and quality statistical consultation are also required. All materials must be sent to Stephen G. Letters of reference must be sent directly by referees to Stephen West. Be sure to include "Quantitative Search" in the subject line when sending e-mail. Application deadline is **November 2, 2012**; if not filled, every two weeks thereafter until the search is closed. A background check is required for employment.
