Position. An *open-rank tenure-track* faculty position is available starting September 1, 2012.

The College of Education and Human Development at the University of Delaware seeks applications from experienced researchers with strong quantitative skills and a record of designing and implementing cluster randomized trials and conducting sophisticated statistical analyses (e.g., HLM, value-added analyses, longitudinal and panel data analyses).

Qualifications. A Ph.D. in education, human development, applied statistics, economics, prevention sciences or a related field with extensive training in quantitative methods is required. Applicants must have experience with planning and carrying out research and evaluation studies of programs and policies. Successful applicants will demonstrate success or strong potential in attracting external funding for their research and in working as a member of an interdisciplinary team. Teaching experience at the university level is desirable.

Responsibilities. Position responsibilities include: developing and conducting externally funded multidisciplinary research and evaluation projects, ideally in collaboration with other faculty in the College on topics of national importance; teaching; and advisement of doctoral students.

College. The College of Education and Human Development is recognized as a leading school of education, ranking 26th nationally. The College includes faculty in Education, Human Development and Family Studies, and seven R&D and service-oriented centers. The successful applicant will join this productive faculty who have received external grants from the National Science Foundation, the Institute of Education Sciences, the National Institutes of Health, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, state agencies, and private foundations.
