

Post-doctoral Fellow in Health Psychology

The Department of Clinical-Community Psychology at the University of South Carolina invites applications for a post-doctoral research position. Post-doctoral applicants should have experience in biostatistics, psychology, public health, statistics, or a related discipline with advanced skills in social science data analysis. Applicants having completed all the requirements for a doctoral degree except final defense of their dissertation will also be considered. The fellow will work with Professor Dawn K. Wilson and her multidisciplinary team of collaborators in the fields of psychology, public health, geography, and medicine.

The fellow will provide expertise in statistical methods and data analysis and will be encouraged to take the lead on manuscripts related to several NIH group randomized trials. The NIH trials are testing innovative interventions based on ecological theories for increasing physical activity and obesity prevention in underserved populations. The fellow will contribute to the planning and execution of data analyses, provide analytic and methodological oversight for on-going projects, prepare and submit manuscripts. Applicants should have experience with multiple statistical packages, excellent computer skills, good verbal and written communication skills, and supervisory abilities. This is a 1-2 year position and pay is between \$40,000 and \$45,000 a year depending on qualifications.
