Open Rank Tenure-related Faculty Position

The Counseling Psychology and Human Services Department at the University of Oregon (UO) is seeking to hire a 9-month, open rank faculty member for its program in Family and Human Services (FHS), with preference for a faculty member at the advanced assistant or early associate level, to begin fall, 2012. Candidates should have a program of research focusing on alcohol and other drug (AOD) prevention and intervention, especially related to improving the wellbeing of marginalized and traditionally underserved youth, families, and/or communities. The new faculty member will collaborate with current faculty members across the College of Education (COE), UO, and FHS community stakeholders to engage in work aimed at improving health and educational outcomes for traditionally underserved populations.

Required Qualifications:

Ph.D. degree in a human sciences field, such as Psychology, Family Science, Public Health, Counseling, Human Services, or related fields; Established record of scholarly productivity; Track record or potential for external funding, particularly through federal agencies; Expertise in prevention science with emphasis on AOD research; Experience or potential to work in or coordinate school- or community-based intervention programs; Track record or potential for excellence in teaching and training; Ability to advise and supervise undergraduate student research; Ability to prepare students to work with ethnically and culturally diverse clientele including, rural and low-income families; Demonstrated commitment to enhancing multicultural competencies and promoting social justice in training activities; Ability to work collaboratively and collegially with others in the department and across the University.

Preferred Qualifications:

Oregon psychology license eligible, AAMFT approved supervisor eligible, National Counselor Certification Eligible, or similar; Advanced assistant or early associate level

Responsibilities: Teach undergraduate courses and potentially graduate courses; contribute to program development of the dynamic undergraduate program in Family and Human Services (FHS); help expand coursework related to AOD intervention and treatment, especially as related to student competency development central to CSHSE accreditation; collaborate with the UO Substance Abuse Prevention Program (SAPP); contribute to the implementation of the COE-wide diversity strategic plan; conduct an active, externally funded research program in AOD prevention and/or intervention; contribute to department, college, and university governance in a manner consistent with the needs of a major research university; and contribute to emerging COE continuing and distance education activities.

The Family and Human Services program is accredited by the Council for Standards in Human Services Education (CSHSE) and maintains relationships with more than 130 community service agencies, NPOs, and NGOs. Faculty members are dedicated to enhancing multicultural competencies, promoting social justice, and using an ecological model as a conceptual framework in teaching and training. The FHS program is housed in the Department of Counseling Psychology and Human Services, with the Couples & Family Therapy masters and the Counseling Psychology doctoral programs. Currently, the department also is developing a masters' specialization in Prevention Science and a Spanish-language certification for human service professionals.
